

# Make the Olympic Rings

## KEY LEARNING

The Olympic rings are referred to as “the Olympic symbol” and are recognised throughout the world. When used in its five-colour version, the rings are interlaced from left to right; the blue, black and red rings at the top, the yellow and green rings at the bottom. The Olympic rings represent the union of five continents and the meeting of athletes from throughout the world at the Olympic Games

## GOAL OF THE ACTIVITY

Colour in the Olympic rings or craft the Olympic Rings. Have students talk about the significance of this symbol.

## WHAT YOU NEED:

### Option 1: Colouring Page

- Print Olympic Ring template colouring page (below)

### Option 2: Craft Olympic Rings

- 5 paper plates for each set of rings.
- Paintcolors: Red, Blue, Green, Yellow, Black
- Scissors
- Glue

## HOW TO CRAFT THE OLYMPIC RINGS





## DIRECTIONS

**Step 1:** Get 5 paper plates and have students cut out the middle of the paper plate.



**Step 2:** Have students paint each of the Olympic Ring colours.



**Step 3.** When Rings are dry, have students cut one side of the Yellow and Green Rings and then loop them into the other Rings and glue them together.
